Free drive-thru testing is coming up in two Panhandle locations this week:

- Scottsbluff: Friday & Saturday from 8am-Noon: Panhandle Public Health District, 18 W. 16th St
- Sidney: Sunday from 8am-Noon: Sidney Regional Medical Center, 1000 Pole Creek Crossing

COVID-19 testing is available at Community Action Health Center Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays from 7am-8am. Testing is open to those that are symptomatic or close contact to a positive case. Sign up today <u>https://tinyurl.com/y7msahzq</u>.

Unified Command confirms three new cases, they are as follows:

Close contact and exposure are defined as at least 15 minutes, less than six feet apart. There are no community exposure sites identified. The investigations are underway, all close contacts will be quarantined and actively monitored twice daily for fever and respiratory symptoms by public health officials.

Three cases have recovered in Scotts Bluff County bringing the total recoveries to 142.
