Two COVID cases of the Omicron variant identified in the Panhandle, Changes in COVID isolation and quarantine guidance

Two COVID cases of the Omicron variant have been identified in the Panhandle. This variant may spread more easily than other variants, including Delta.

Only one of the current monoclonal antibody treatments is effective against this variant and will initially be in limited supply due to high demand throughout the nation. Panhandle residents are urged to take all necessary precautions for the safety of themselves and their loved ones.

"COVID vaccination decreases the risk of severe disease, hospitalization, and death from COVID. We strongly encourage COVID vaccination for everyone 5 and older and boosters for everyone 16 and older. Vaccination is the best way to protect yourself and reduce the impact of COVID on our communities," said Kim Engel, Panhandle Public Health District Director.

If You Test Positive for COVID (Isolate)

Everyone, regardless of vaccination status.

- Stay home for 5 days.
- If you have no symptoms or your symptoms are resolving after 5 days, you can leave your house.
- Continue to wear a mask around others for 5 additional days.

If you have a fever, continue to stay home until your fever resolves.

If You Were Exposed to Someone with COVID (Quarantine)

Data from South Africa and the United Kingdom demonstrate that vaccine effectiveness against infection for two doses of an mRNA vaccine is approximately 35%. A COVID vaccine booster dose restores vaccine effectiveness against infection to 75%.
